Students have the opportunity to work on challenging construction projects and come alongside inspiring community leaders, meeting the true needs of the community. Each project is picked with an unwavering commitment to partnering with and empowering families, schools, and the local church. These projects are a part of a much larger vision of transformation producing real, sustainable change within a community. We work on these projects week after week, year after year, so students know they're part of a real change.

In the evenings students participate in evening programming, which includes interactive messages, creative video teachings, and powerful worship music encouraging them to dig deeper and take the next step in their faith. In the process, students create unforgettable memories and friendships while worshiping and growing together in God's name.

What We Do

Next Step leads sustainable building projects in multiple communities around the world, addressing the greatest needs in each community. Our work is only possible through deeply rooted partnerships with community members, missionaries, and the local church. These projects significantly impact the physical lives of each family we work with, while enabling us to build relationships and love like Christ calls us to in the process. For nine weeks during the summer, you will lead one-week life-changing mission trips in a single community for junior high and high school students from across the country.

What is a Next Step Internship?

A Next Step Internship gives you the unique opportunity for hands-on experience in leading missions while growing in a specific area related to your field of interest. If you are a Team Leader, you will gain invaluable leadership skills from learning to lead a team of your peers. Emcees will gain experience speaking in front of hundreds of students 6 nights a week! Worship teams will have the opportunity to facilitate evening services each day, through creative set lists and powerful music. With this incredible hands-on experience comes the beauty of building relationships: relationships with the team you will serve on, the community you will partner alongside, and the churches you will serve with. You will be humbled by the responsibility, challenged by the tasks in front of you, and transformed as you experience and share the love of Christ by becoming His hands and feet.

There is no hiding it; a summer on Next Step Staff is a challenging one. There is little sleep, and no down time, it's a 24/7 job that will require everything in you. But if you are ready to really push yourself to live in true community and learn to humbly serve the way Christ calls, then this is for you!

As the Worship Leader you will oversee and develop the Worship Team, and lead students in nightly worship. You will work closely with the Emcee on all musical elements of the nightly programing, as well as the Media Tech on all logistical transitions and sound. You will work with youth leaders each new week to understand the worship experiences students are familiar with in order to create an atmosphere conducive to worship. This includes facilitating worship for multiple denominations throughout the summer and learning to engage people with various backgrounds in worship theology. You will lead 54 nights of evening programming in one summer.

You will also have the opportunity to serve as a spiritual mentor to students and facilitate positive conversations throughout each day. Your job is to create a healthy and dynamic balance between the experience each mission team has in the community (opportunity for increased awareness, learning, and cultural engagement), with standards of empowerment, sustainability and local leadership within the community.

This may be a result of a large week on site, or because a staff member came down with a sickness. Your job is to be flexible!

At any point during the summer, Flex Staff may be permanently placed with a new team to fill an open position.

What is a Next Step Construction Internship?

A Next Step Construction Internship gives you the unique opportunity for hands-on experience in managing construction projects. Selecting over fifteen projects in a summer, drawing plans, and estimating materials, the responsibility you are given will be an incredible opportunity. As part of the Construction Team you will be able to take the things you have learned in school and apply them directly to the mission field. Your skills and direct efforts will provide a new home for a family living without heat, or a safe wheelchair ramp for someone with a disability. This summer you will continue to build upon your foundation of construction knowledge, and be pushed to apply your construction skills in a way that is unlike any other internship or co-op within this field. You will come away from the summer with a better understanding not only of construction, but also of missions and youth ministry in general. You will be humbled by the responsibility, challenged by the tasks in front of you, and transformed as you experience and share the love of Christ by becoming His hands and feet.

Job Position

As the Construction Manager, you are responsible for overseeing all construction projects that take place in the community you are serving with. You will work closely with our full-time Construction Coordinators, and local full-time staff in the community on project selection and proper project setup. You will also oversee estimating, purchasing, and budgeting procedures for all aspects of the construction. With that, you will be directing and leading 2-3 other construction team members as well as volunteers, to properly complete all projects. Your ultimate responsibility will be to ensure all building projects are running smoothly for the summer.

Job Position

As a Construction Team Member you will have the opportunity to lead students in various work projects within the community. This position will focus on individual project foreman duties with opportunities for participating in management responsibilities, such as estimating and designing projects.

- Teach students the necessary skills to complete a project
- Assist Construction Manger in designing and drawing plans for projects, estimating, creating bill of materials, and purchasing and delivering materials
- Assist Construction Manger in maintaining an Electronic Job File
- Assist Construction Manager in completing weekly project inspection forms
- Maintain Next Step safety standards
- Participate alongside students at work projects
- Participate in daily devos and nightly worship

What makes Next Step Summer Staff different?

We know there are a lot of summer internships and co-ops out there for you, but we feel confident stating that you won't find another one like ours. As a part of staff, you will change lives... and as a result, your life will be changed. We've watched it happen summer after summer.

Our Programming

Our programming is designed to invite students into a real relationship with Christ. Students are encouraged to step out boldly in their faith, and as a Next Step Summer Staff, you get the opportunity to walk alongside each student and see these changes first hand. So whether you are teaching, leading worship, working ProPresenter, or joining in worship with the students, you will move and be moved by God each evening and throughout each day.

Our Projects

Next Step was created with the intentions and commitment to serve alongside communities in a way that is dignifying to those living there. We strive for each project to be a partnership. Whether we are building an entire new home for a family, putting a new roof on a house, flooring, siding, building a deck, or working on a community center, we seek to invest into a relationship that fosters sustainable change in the community. Through trusting relationships, we are able to listen and be led by local leaders knowing that the true physical needs of the community will be met. You, as well as students are left knowing we've really made an impact- holistically transforming the communities we work alongside.

Our Impact

We are dedicated to an impact that lasts much longer than one week for our students, or one summer for the communities we work with. We spend significant time in each community on a year round basis, and as Summer Staff, you'll see the results of these long-standing relationships. You'll meet community members that treat you like family and witness first-hand, the holistic impact each project has on the community year after year. As for the impact on the lives of the students, check out our MyStep website. This is a tool we have created and provide to each student that comes on a Next Step trip, as a way to encourage him or her to stay connected with their faith. This is done through daily devotions, an accountability program, truth or dare testimonies, and prayer, for all 52 weeks of the year.

What To Expect

Your summer with Next Step will begin with an intense week of training in Madison, Wisconsin. During training, you will get to know your team, learn the details of the program, and gain a better understanding of the community you will be serving with. Our goal during training is to instill confidence within you so you feel prepared and equipped for your summer on site.

After training week, you will head off to the community you will call home for the summer. Depending on if the site is domestic or international, you will fly or drive with your team. Once you arrive, you will have a week to get settled in and become acquainted with the community you will be working alongside.

Before you know it, the first group of students will arrive and your nine weeks of mission trips will begin! Each group will bring anywhere from 30-100 energetic Jr. High and High School students. This is your opportunity to lead these students in worship, work projects, and make a lasting impact on their lives. The groups will arrive on Sunday afternoons and leave on Saturday mornings. The time between each new group is spent with your team resting, relaxing, and getting ready to do it all over again!

There is no doubt this is an intense summer. There isn't much down time or time for breaks; but if you are serious about missions and developing yourself into an effective leader for Christ's Kingdom, then a Next Step Summer Staff position is for you.

Summer Staff Facts

Dates: Our summer internship program is an 11-week program running from May 22nd to August 8th.

Location: You will be placed at one of the 16 locations in which we serve.

Age Requirement: All Summer Staff are required to be at least 18 years of age and have been out of high school for one full year.

Training: Your internship includes one week of training prior to being sent out to the community you will live in for the summer. This training covers program and community details, as well as the ins and outs of a Next Step mission trip. You will also be trained on the responsibilities of your specific position. Team Leaders are required to attend an additional weekend of online training in April.

Benefits: Food, lodging, and travel are all covered while on site for the duration of your internship.

Salary: All Next Step Summer Staff positions are paid.

Support Raising: Our Internship Positions [except construction] require you to raise support.

Typical Schedule

As Summer Staff, your day to day will change often and require flexibility. This schedule is given as a general outline of what you can expect, understanding that your schedule will vary dependent upon your position.

Sunday

Groups arrive on Sundays between 3 PM - 5 PM and your week begins! Sunday nights involve a brief orientation with the group leaders, dinner, worship, and an explanation of the projects for the week.

Monday-Thursday

The construction workweek runs Monday through Thursday. You will wake the students up at 7 AM and serve breakfast at 7:15 AM. Students will eat, pack their own lunch, and load up for the work sites. After a morning devotional, crews head out to their worksites at about 8:30 AM. You will head out with a crew at this time, working alongside students and being a part of leading the construction projects! You will work all day, break for lunch and a group devotional, and then continue the project. Pack up begins at about 3:00 PM and by 3:30 PM you're heading back to home base. From 4 PM – 6 PM there's time to shower, free time, and time to hangout and get to know the students. You'll serve dinner at 6 PM and begin worship at 7 PM. After worship it's free time until lights out. After lights out you will have a brief staff meeting and head to bed.

Friday

Friday is a free day on the mission site. Each location will spend their day doing something fun in the community. To conclude the week, Friday evening will typically be focused on a community event or BBQ; inviting the community members you've met throughout the week and summer to join the group in food and fellowship.

Saturday

The groups will clean, pack up, and leave on Saturday morning. You will assist them in packing up and say your goodbyes. The remainder of your Saturday will be spent cleaning, shopping for supplies and materials, and catching up on some much needed rest before it starts all over again on Sunday afternoon!

Support Raising Requirement

Next Step Internships [not construction] require you to raise support. Many Summer Staff ask us why we have this requirement and where the support goes...

It's important to understand that our trips are anything but ordinary "paint a house" mission trips. For this reason, Next Step is committed to funding projects that really impact the community and meet the greatest needs. We want to build, transform, and empower the communities and families we work alongside. These projects take significant money, which is where you come in!

When you commit to serving as Summer Staff in a community with Next Step, you commit to making it possible to do the type of building that is sustainable. This could mean providing a wheel chair ramp to a senior citizen who hasn't left their house in two years because they can't walk down the stairs, or providing a brand new home to a family that previously shared a one bedroom house without heat.

Every year, Next Step Summer Staff raise over \$150,000 allowing us to do the work that we do. It has been a staple of our ministry since the very beginning: a staple that makes us different, a staple that makes us effective. So be humbled and energized when you raise support. It doesn't just go in your pocket. It goes to helping rebuild a community and creating long-term, sustainable changes.

FAQ's

What are the requirements to be on Next Step Summer Staff?

All applicants must be 18 years old and one full year out of high school. CPR certification is required prior to the start of the summer. See positions and requirements for a list of specific position requirements.

Do you have to serve for the whole summer? Are there any part-time internships?All Summer Staff are required to serve from May 22nd through August 8th. There are no part time internships.

Do we receive any training?

Your summer will start with a week of training in Madison, Wisconsin. Here you will learn the ins and outs of the summer and get specific training for your position.

Do we get to choose what community we will be serving in?

There are several things we consider when placing staff and building the teams. First, we consider your specific skills and talents and how they best fit into the communities we work with and the teams that are set up. We also take into consideration where you would like to serve. Lastly, we place based on the needs of Next Step.

Do we serve in the same community all summer?

Yes. You will serve at one location for the entirety of your summer. This applies to everyone, except those hired on as Flex Staff (please see Job Descriptions). Flex Staff have the potential to relocate to various communities throughout the summer dependent on need and situation.

Do we have any time off?

Yes. There is a mid-summer team break on July 7th – July 9th. This will be an opportunity for you and your team to relax, leave site for the weekend, and reenergize for the last few weeks of trips. The goal is for you and your team to feel spiritually refreshed and rested. We ask that everyone stay together as a team during this weekend.

That being said, due to the nature of your position there is very little downtime on a day-to-day basis. Typical weekends are used to shop for supplies, set up new projects, and rest. You will be exhausted, but take it from us; it will be well worth it! The position requires your effort 24/7 for 10 weeks.

How are food and lodging handled?

All of your food and lodging is covered for the entire summer! You will be staying at a church or school in the community you live in. Your new bedroom will most likely be a Sunday School room. You will sleep on an air mattress.

How do I get to training week? How do I get to the community I will be living in?

You are responsible for your transportation to training week on May 22nd and home at the end of the summer on August 8th (one round trip ticket to Madison, Wisconsin). Next Step covers all the rest of your transportation!

If I'm on the Worship Team, do I need to bring my own instrument?

If you are playing the guitar or bass, yes you will need to bring it with you. You will also need to bring extra picks, strings, capos, etc. We will have all cables and amps. If you are playing the keys or drums, we will provide those for you.

If I'm on the Construction Team, do I need to bring my own tools?

No. Next Step has all power tools and hand tools on site. We ask that you do however bring your own Personal Protection Equipment (hard hat, glasses, gloves) and suggest bringing your tool belt. Any tools you choose to bring on site will be at your own risk.

I'm not on the Construction Team: What do I do during the day?

All staff will be expected to go out onto a worksite during the day. You will even likely be leading a site! You will learn some basic skills in managing a construction worksite during training week and throughout the summer from your Construction Team so that you feel comfortable managing student volunteers.

Do I have to attend the end of the summer banquet?

Yes. Traveling back to Wisconsin after your trips have ended is an important part of the summer. It offers you and your team closure from a summer full of life-changing experiences and gives you the opportunity to begin your transition back home. We will celebrate your hard work with friends and family as well as conduct important exit interviews and time to debrief your summer experience.

Can I drive to training? What do I do with my car?

Yes, you can drive to training. We prefer that you arrange to be dropped off in Madison, Wisconsin. If you need to drive to training and leave your car in Wisconsin, you will be leaving it at your own risk and must leave your keys at the Next Step office in case of emergency.

Applying Online

- Submit your online application along with your resume and any required music or teaching samples. Your application will not be considered until all of the requirements are submitted.
- Within one week of submitting your application, you will be contacted and set up for your first phone interview with our Internship Coordinator.
- Within two weeks of your first interview you will be set up for a second phone or Skype interview with our Missions Director.
- Your references will be contacted.
- You will hear back from us within two weeks of your second interview on final hiring decisions.
